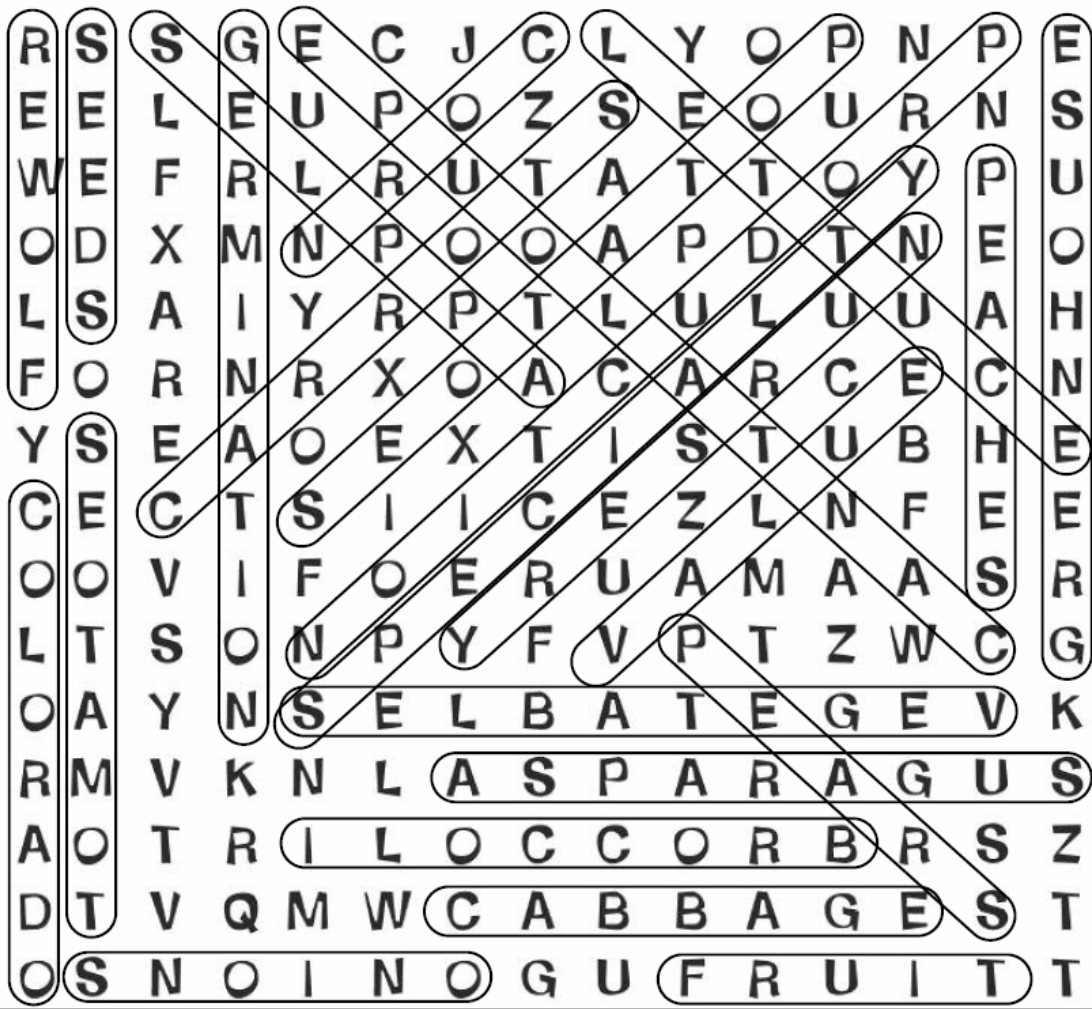

There are 30,500 farms and ranches in Colorado encompassing 30.7 million acres. That's nearly half of the state's total land area.

There are more than 105,000 jobs in Colorado related to agribusiness, contributing \$16 billion annually to the state's economy.

Cattle are the number one agricultural commodity with 2.7 million head of cattle.

Colorado's sheep, lamb and wool production rank fourth in the nation.

There are 36,000 bee colonies producing 2.7 million pounds of honey every year.

Peaches are the largest fruit crop.

Colorado ranks first in production of proso millet. This grass is grown for bird and livestock feed.

Sunflower production ranks fifth in the nation. Sunflowers are used food and oil production.

Colorado produces more than 100 million pounds of pinto beans each year.

Colorado's leading vegetable crop is onions.

64,000 acres in the San Luis Valley is dedicated to potato production. This valley is the largest and highest alpine valley in the world capable of producing crops.
